- 2 Definitions

In the context of this unit standard, *understanding* means that there should be evidence of a learner's thorough comprehension of a topic. A learner with a good understanding of a topic should have applied or should be able to apply what they have learnt to a workplace situation and will be able to alter their practices to the different contexts they are applying their learning to. Assessors should be confident that the learner's understanding is embedded in their practices and behaviour.

Seafood product includes any species of – fish, echinoderm, crustacean, or shellfish

Workplace procedures refer to the policies and procedures set out in a verbal or written form by the employer or organisation. Procedures should reflect industry best practice and current legislation.

Outcomes and performance criteria

Outcome 1

Demonstrate understanding of the requirements and procedures for checking the accuracy of scales.

Range one of – electronic, manual scales.

Performance criteria

- 1.1 Describe the importance of checking scales for accuracy.
- 1.2 Describe the meaning of the terms: nett weight, gross weight and tare weight.
- 1.3 Check scales for accuracy on a suitable working surface.
- 1.4 Take action for weight readings that are outside the tolerances for test weights.

Outcome 2

Weigh seafood product.

Performance criteria

- 2.1 Tare scales for packaging.
- 2.2 Weigh and adjust product as necessary.
- 2.3 Meet other company requirements for weighing product.

Range may include but is not limited to – records, production throughput, product handling, packing, packaging; evidence is required for a minimum of four.

Outcome 3

Label seafood product.

Range evidence is required for one seafood product.

Performance criteria

- 3.1 Label product with the correct information.

Range may include but is not limited to – species, product type, grade, weight of carton, date codes; evidence is required for a minimum of four.

- 3.2 Place label or markings on the packed product.
