Outcome 2

Check and report on horses' stabling requirements.

Performance criteria

2.1 Check the horses' stabling requirements.

Range requirements must include but is not limited to – environmental

conditions, internal and external fittings, welfare, health and safety,

stable dimensions.

2.2 Report on the horses' stabling requirements.

Outcome 3

Carry out the daily stable routine.

Performance criteria

- 3.1 Observe horses for health and well-being, and take appropriate action is taken in accordance with stable procedures.
- 3.2 Prepare horses that require exercise and make ready at the designated time and place in accordance with stable procedures.
- 3.3 Implement the daily routine to ensure that horses, stables, and surroundings are safe and tidy in accordance with stable procedures.

Range routine must include but is not limited to – clean, tidy, without

hazard to people and/or animals, equipment stored in designated

place.

Outcome 4

Feed stabled horses.

Performance criteria

- 4.1 Prepare horse feeds and feed horses in accordance with stable procedures.
- 4.2 Recognise problems with feeding and watering and report in accordance with stable procedures.

Outcome 5

Demonstrate knowledge of, and implement, preventative health requirements.

Performance criteria

5.1 Describe reasons for implementing preventative health measures in terms of introducing a new horse to the stable.

5.2 Implement an ongoing preventative health programme in accordance with stable procedures.

Range includes but is not limited to – worming, vaccination.

Outcome 6

Recognise and report stable vices and behavioural problems.

Range vices may include but are not limited to – weaving, door kicking, crib biting, windsucking, front footing, biting, tearing covers, box walking.

Performance criteria

- 6.1 Describe stable vices and behavioural problems in terms of control measures suitable for rectifying the problems.
- 6.2 Report stable vices and behavioural problems in accordance with stable procedures.
- 6.3 Identify the reasons why horses develop stable vices and behavioural problems.

Outcome7

Check and report on stable consumables.

Performance criteria

- 7.1 Store feed supplies free from contamination and check for quality and quantity, and report in accordance with stable procedures.
- 7.2 Check stable bedding supply for quantity and report in accordance with stable procedures.
- 7.3 Check equipment for damage and report signs of damage in accordance with stable procedures.
