

<b>Title</b>	<b>Adapt a commercial pattern for a garment</b>

<b>Purpose</b>	People credited with this unit standard are able to: select a commercial garment pattern for adaptation; and adapt the pattern.
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<b>Classification</b>	Home and Life Sciences > Home and Life Sciences - Textile Technology
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<b>Available grade</b>	Achieved
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### Explanatory notes

- 1 Definition  
*Commercial pattern* refers to those which are chosen from a catalogue and used by people who sew at home (domestic). Tissue paper outlines of each piece of the garment, explanatory notes, guide sheets providing sewing information, and tables of standard body measurements are included in the pattern envelope.
- 2 Adaptations, for this unit standard, are of a structural nature such as: inserts, pleats, yokes, altering sleeve types, welt pockets.
- 3 It is intended that this unit standard should be used alongside another textile construction unit standard. This should help provide evidence for assessment against Outcome 2.
- 4 Learning and assessment activities carried out in relation to this unit standard must be conducted in a manner that is consistent with the Health and Safety in Employment Act 1992.

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### Outcomes and evidence requirements

#### Outcome 1

Select a commercial garment pattern for adaptation.

#### Evidence requirements

- 1.1 Design details are identified for an intended garment.

Range may include but is not limited to use of – sketches, description, visual aid.

- 1.2 The commercial pattern selected is able to be adapted to meet the design details of the intended garment.

## Outcome 2

Adapt the pattern.

### Evidence requirements

- 2.1 The pattern, as adapted, meets the requirements of the design details, and enables the garment to be constructed.

Range pattern pieces, any changes to the guidesheet and envelope.
