

Title	Artificially pollinate a kiwifruit crop

Purpose	This unit standard is for people working, or intending to work, in kiwifruit production. People credited with this unit standard are able to collect male pollen, and pollinate female flowers.

Outcomes and evidence requirements

Outcome 1

Collect male pollen.

Evidence requirements

1.1 Collection is carried out in weather conditions appropriate to the collection of pollen.

1.2 Male pollen is collected in accordance with workplace procedures.

Range vacuum machine or flower harvest.

Outcome 2

Pollinate female flowers.

Evidence requirements

2.1 Receptive female flowers are recognised, and flowers are pollinated in accordance with workplace procedures.

Range hand or sprayed or blown.

2.2 Pollination success is checked in accordance with workplace procedures.
