*Organisational procedures* refer to documents that include: worksite rules, codes, and practices; equipment operating instructions; manufacturer's specifications; production specifications; documented quality management systems; and health and safety requirements, including the use of PPE.  
*Packaging* refers to cardboard, corrugated card, trays, or flexible packaging films; glass, and metal or plastic containers.  
*PPE* refers to personal protective equipment such as protective clothing, gloves, safety glasses, headwear, footwear, hearing protection, safety devices.  
*Related products* refer to beverages, household products, or personal care products.
- 3 Assessment information  
All activities and evidence must be in accordance with organisational procedures.

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### Outcomes and performance criteria

#### Outcome 1

Identify product and packaging faults on food or related products production lines.

**Performance criteria**

- 1.1 Variations from specifications in product or packaging are identified.
- Range product specifications may include but are not limited to – quality, quantity, weight, colour, consistency, composition; packaging specifications may include but are not limited to – printing, colour, height, depth, tuck, seal.
- 1.2 Faults in specified technical performance of product or packaging equipment are identified.
- 1.3 Identified faults and variations are rectified and/or reported.
- Range may include but is not limited to – in a timely manner, authorisation.
