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Outcomes and performance criteria

Outcome 1

Harvest muka harakeke to complete kete handles.

Performance criteria

- 1.1 Permission to harvest muka has been granted.
- 1.2 Tools and materials for harvesting and preparation are identified.
- 1.3 Muka is harvested in accordance with the tikanga of Te Whare Pora.

Outcome 2

Prepare muka harakeke to complete kete handles.

Performance criteria

- 2.1 Whenu is graded according to quality required to produce muka.
- 2.2 Whenu are sized consistently to ensure completion of kete handles.
- 2.3 Whenu are prepared in sufficient quantities to ensure completion of kete handles.

Outcome 3

Extract and whiri muka to complete kete handles.

Performance criteria

- 3.1 Muka is extracted and para removed.
- 3.2 Muka is scraped and rubbed until it meets the required consistency for kete handles.
- 3.3 Whiri muka handles and attach to kete.
