Contemporary refers to post-1945.

Customary refers to pre-1945.

*Imagery* may include but is not limited to photographs, pictures, photocopies, videos. *Kete tahā/hue* is a basket designed to contain rounded gourd (customary, holding preserved food i.e.: ipu, oko, mata, kai ota, hue) or container (contemporary). *Quality* ensures whenu is graded to complete task. Includes but is not limited to – broken, infected or discoloured rau.

*Quantity* ensures enough whenu is prepared to complete kete tahā/hue. *Size* refers to whenu width and length.

*Specifications* may include but is not limited to – title/untitled, artist details including whakapapa connections, dates of construction, dimensions (length, width, height), collection details.
