Outcome 2

Draft whāriki whakairo design.

Range may include - graph paper, pens, pencils, computer, draft paper.

Evidence requirements

- 2.1 Design for whāriki is sketched and developed.

Range includes but is not limited to – size, patterns, colours, decorative elements, materials.

Outcome 3

Raranga whāriki whakairo harakeke.

Evidence requirements

- 3.1 Pattern is selected.

Range: two colours minimum, two joins minimum.

- 3.2 Raranga whāriki whakairo harakeke in accordance with project specifications and kaupapa.

- 3.3 Storage methods for whāriki is described and applied.
