<b>Purpose</b>	People credited with this unit standard are able to: demonstrate knowledge of vine crop growth, health and training systems; train and prune vines consistent with the training system used.

- 3 Definition  
*Workplace procedures* refer to policies and procedures on safety, operation, and production set down by the employer or host organisation.
- 4 Vines are plants whose stem is indeterminate, typically require support, and climb by tendrils, twining or creeping along the ground. Examples include – kiwifruit, grapes, tomatoes, cucumbers, capsicums.

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### Outcomes and performance criteria

#### Outcome 1

Demonstrate knowledge of vine crop growth, health and training systems.

#### Performance criteria

- 1.1 Describe a main form of training system in terms of its features.  
Range evidence of one training system relevant to crop type is required.
- 1.2 Identify parts of the vine that are trained and pruned in terms of their functions.
- 1.3 Describe vine growth in terms of the effects of apical dominance.
- 1.4 Describe the relationship between wound callus and healing, and plant health.

**Outcome 2**

Train and prune vines consistent with the training system used.

**Performance criteria**

- 2.1 Select, use, and maintain tools and equipment.
- 2.2 Support main trunk until it reaches the wires.
- 2.3 Develop leaders and hold along wires.
- 2.4 Remove unwanted growth.
- 2.5 Remove dead, diseased, or pest infested growth.
- 2.6 Maintain records of training and pruning vines.
