Explain a sociological theory in detail means to support the explanation with relevant detail, which may include consideration of: the groups and/or institutions involved; particular facts, events or processes; and one key concept in detail, or two or more key concepts in less detail.

Comprehensively explain a sociological theory means to use key concepts in detail and to support the explanation with appropriate evidence and examples.

A *sociological theory* is a body of ideas that attempts to explain the structure of groups, organisations, and societies, and how people interact in these contexts.
